Golden, Colorado, April 30, 2003 – CoorsTek, Inc., a leading designer and manufacturer of critical components and integrated assemblies for the semiconductor capital equipment industry and other high technology markets, today announced that it has expanded its agreement with InVision – just one year after they signed their initial agreement. InVision Technologies, located in Newark, California, is the leading provider of explosive detection systems used in airports worldwide.

As announced in a March 14, 2002 press release, CoorsTek contracted to provide InVision Technologies with component manufacturing, supply chain management and assembly services for InVision CTX 2500 and CTX 5500DS explosives detection systems. The success of this relationship as well as some significant milestone achievements have led to additional contract awards.

Specifically, CoorsTek will perform some of the assembly services, engineering services and all supply chain management for InVision's CTX 9000. Under the terms of the contract, CoorsTek will now precision-machine many of the large metal components used in the systems, manage 100 percent of the supply chain, perform some in-house assembly for InVision machines, and perform final quality testing.

Late last year, CoorsTek played a key role assisting InVision's compliance with Congress' Homeland Security Act. Calling for several hundred completed machines in the 3rd and 4th quarter. CoorsTek

worked around the clock in December to meet the December 31 deadline.

On top of this December crunch, CoorsTek was called upon to assist the InVision field service group with some required repairs over the Christmas holiday. Phillip Choo, a CoorsTek engineer primarily dedicated to the manufacturing side, happily complied with several other team members. “For all practical purposes, our entire staff is on-call 24-7,” remarks Derek Johnson, the CoorsTek COO. “This is the type of service we have come to expect from CoorsTek – we could not have met the deadline without their assistance,” said Don Mattson, Chief Operating Officer for InVision.

CoorsTek manufactures critical components, and complete assemblies for semiconductor, automotive, electronics, medical, telecommunications, and other industrial applications.
